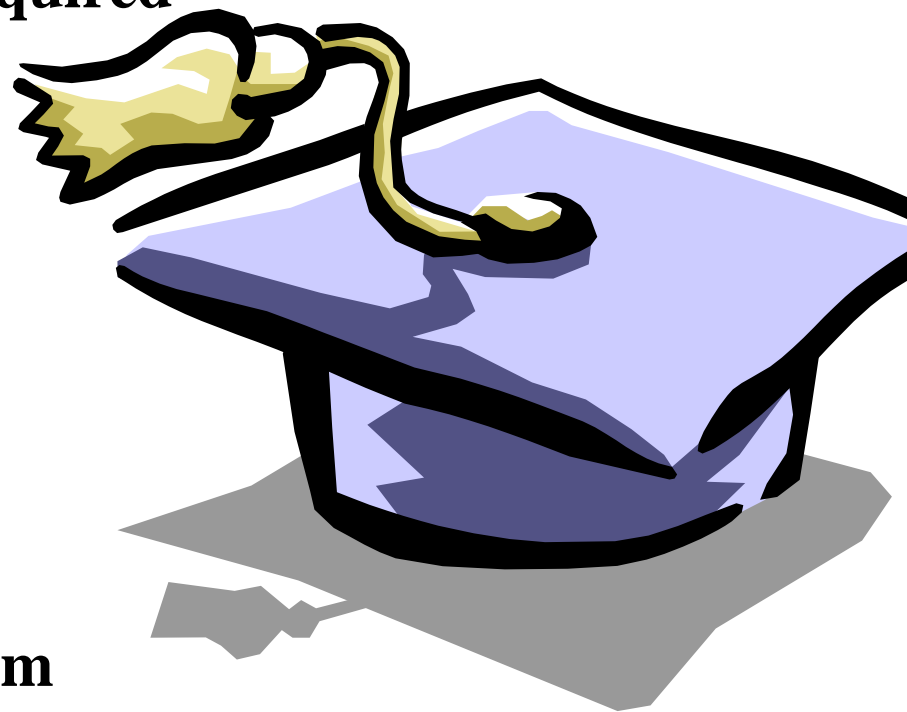

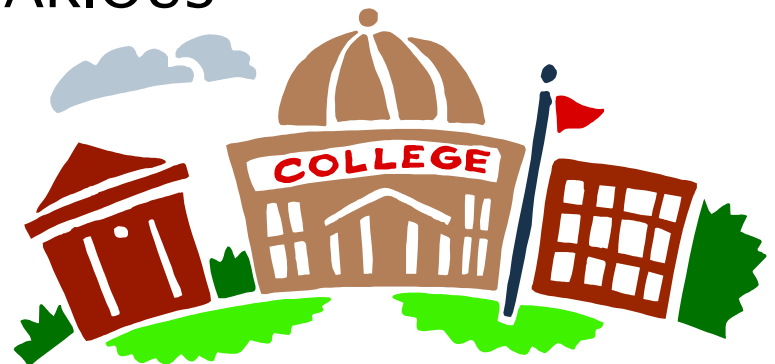

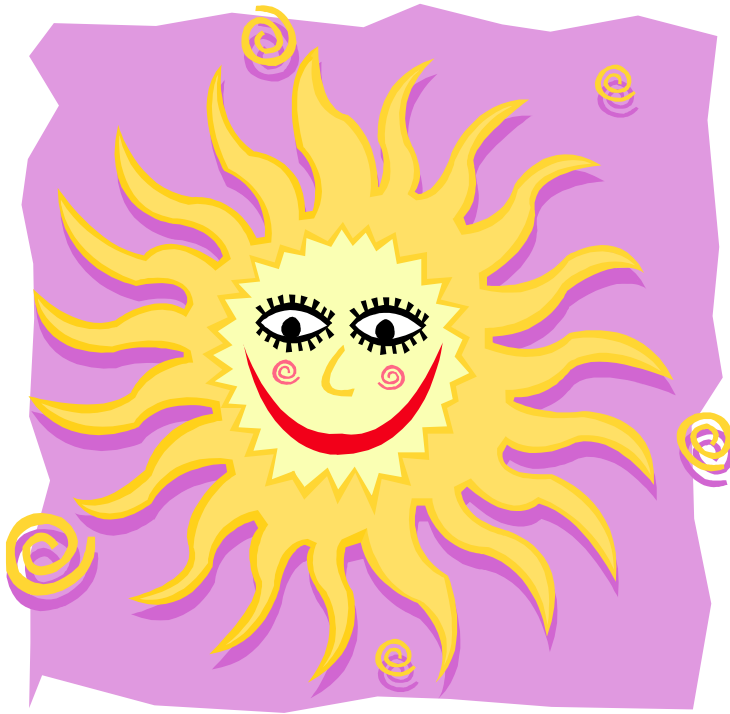
Focus on Academics

- ▶ Tuition: \$140 per semester
- ▶ Busing: \$35 per semester


