Did you know?

Approximately 1.5 million high school students nationwide experience physical abuse from a partner in a year.

Girls and young women between the ages of 16 and 24 experience the highest rate of intimate partner violence — almost triple the national average.

One in 10 high school students has been purposefully hit, slapped or physically hurt by a boyfriend or girlfriend.

Warning signs of abuse

- Partner checking cell phone or email without permission.
- Constant put downs.
- Extreme jealousy, insecurity or possessiveness.
- Explosive temper.
- Physically hurting you in anyway.
- Isolating you from family or friends.
- Pressuring or forcing intimacy.
- Making false accusations.
- Manipulation.
